SPEAKERS

Donald J. Lewis, Associate Professor, AB (USC), JD (Emory), LL.M. (London), is the Director of the East Asian International Economic Law and Policy Programme, at the University of Hong Kong Faculty of Law. He has written extensively, and lectured in Asia, Europe and North America, on issues of PRC trade and investment law and China's WTO accession. In 2000, he was a Visiting Scholar, East Asian Legal Studies Programme, Harvard Law School. He has served as a consultant and expert witness on Chinese law for international law firms and multinational corporations. He is general editor of *China Investment Manual* (1998), co-author of *PRC Joint Ventures-Drafting and Negotiating Contracts* (1997) and general editor of *The Life and Death of a Joint Venture in China* (1996).

Peter Rhodes, is the Regional Professional Support Manager - Asia, for the international law firm Denton Wilde Sapte. He is a graduate of Auckland University, New Zealand (LL.B.) and Harvard Law School (LL.M.). He was formerly an associate professor at the Faculty of Law, University of Hong Kong and was Dean of the faculty for 6 years. He has worked and lectured in the Asia-Pacific region for the past 20 years. His main areas of expertise, on which he has advised and published, are international economic regulation and regional economic integration.

Esther Nägeli, Attorney-at-Law, LL.M. (University of Hong Kong) is a partner with KPMG Legal and Head of KPMG Legal, Zurich. She is the Chairperson of the Legal Chapter and a member of the Executive Board of the Swiss-Chinese Chamber of Commerce. Esther Nägeli has substantial experience in advising corporate clients regarding direct investment, mergers, acquisitions and joint ventures in cross-border transactions. She has specialized in China investment law and has provided legal advice in China to Swiss investors on their transactions. She is regularly publishing on China law developments and currently involved in a major research project on alternative investment forms in China.

Wenbin Wei, Attorney-at-Law (University of Beijing), LL.M. in International Business Law (University of Zurich) is an associate lawyer with KPMG Legal, Zurich and was formerly an associate lawyer with one of the leading law firms in Beijing. He advises corporate foreign clients on their investments and cross-border transactions with China. He was also a lecturer with the University of Economics and Technology in Beijing. Mr. Wei is a member of the Legal Chapter of the Swiss-Chinese Chamber of Commerce.

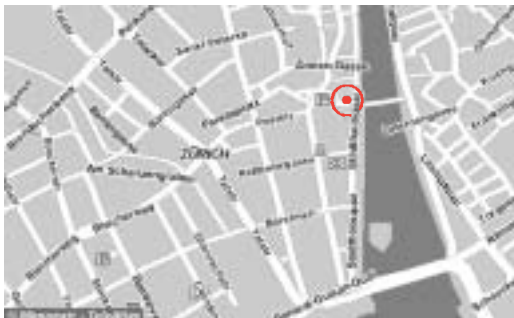
