The humanitarian costs of the coronavirus outbreak have continued to mount, with more than 79,000 people infected in China alone, where the outbreak originated. The number of people who have been confirmed to have died as a result of the virus has now surpassed 2,900.

It has hit a growing list of companies by sapping consumer demand in key regions and disrupting supply chains. Chinese stocks, the travel sector and energy funds have also been hit.

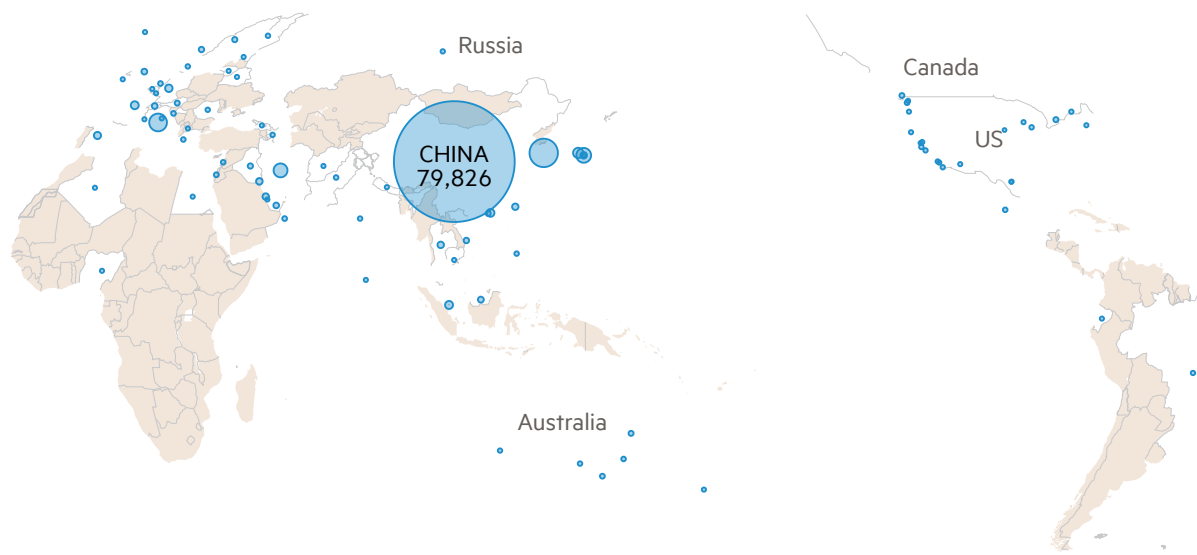

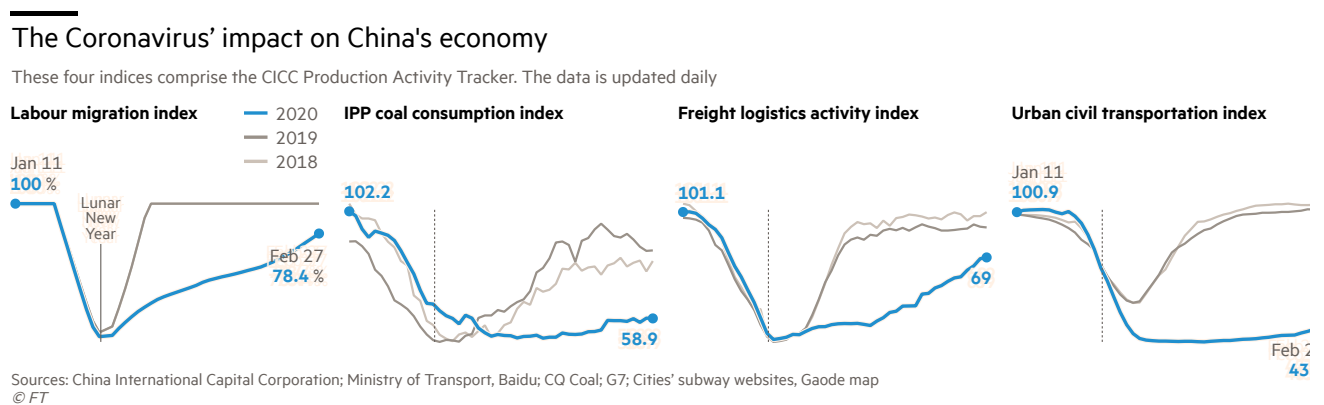

The data for this map comes from a [dashboard](#) maintained by the Johns Hopkins University Center for Systems Science Engineering, which has [combined data](#) from the World Health Organization, the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control, the Chinese Center for Disease Control and Prevention. It also incorporates data from the Chinese medical community website DXY, which aggregates live situation reports from the Chinese National Health Commission and local CCDC.

The coronavirus has now spread to more than 60 countries, causing major disruption across several industries.

The Financial Times has gathered some key indicators to track the impact of the virus on China's economy:



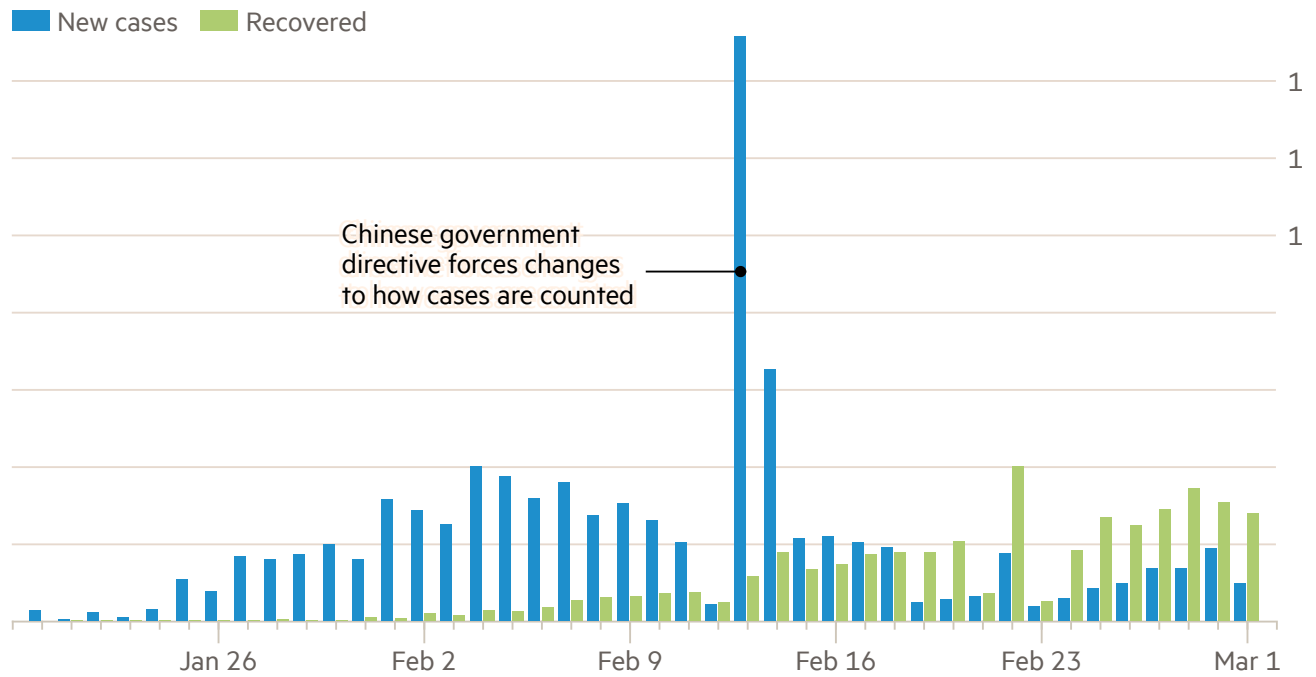
About the China indicators:

- The **IPP coal consumption index** tracks the volume of coal use reported by the six largest independent power producers
- The **Labour migration index** estimates the per cent of migrant workers who have returned to their city of employment
- The **Freight logistics activity index** is a combination of capacity utilisation of heavy trucks and activity in industrial parks
- The **Urban civil transportation index** combines traffic congestion and subway traffic in major cities

New coronavirus cases are now rising faster outside China than within. The total number of recovered cases has now reached 42,595.
